You can be one of the 6 lucky people privileged to turn a cowboy hat (or other type) under the guidance of Johannes Michelsen, who invented hat turning in the 1980's. You'll be working with wet figured maple and will be making a hat fitted to your head and made comfortable to wear with soft fitting liners inside the hat. The entire course will be an adventure. The hat blanks will be like nothing you've ever seen. You will use light boxes and light rods to illuminate your cuts from the inside of the hat. The extraordinary flexibility of fresh wet maple will permit banded bending jigs to make the brim the exact shape you want for your hat. Michelsen will *demonstrate* at the Maine Woodturners Club January meeting on Saturday, Jan 17, 2009. His *intensive workshop* will take place at the Woodturning School over the rest of Martin Luther King 3-day weekend, January 18 & 19, 2009. Most important: no one goes home without a hat; no one goes home without a smile; everyone goes home a significantly more accomplished turner. Cost of the workshop at the Woodturning School is \$585, and will include personal instruction, all materials, breakfast pastries, lunch, snacks and beverages.
