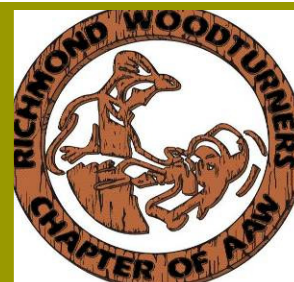

Tagua Nut Turning with Larry

Larry from the Tidewater Turners came to visit with us last month. He turns Tagua nuts, These are the seeds of a South American palm like tree which takes ~15 years to mature. The seeds are 20 -50 cm in diameter, are hard and white centers (therefore the name "vegetable ivory").

Start turning by making a wooden jam chuck to fit the bottom of the nut (pointy end up). Set the nut into the concave and use the tail stock to hold it in place. Add thick CA glue all around the base of the nut. Hit it with accelerator. Repeat until the gap in the jam chuck is full.

Start turning the outside to get the shape with scrapers & a fast speed. Finish the outside and then hollow out the inside. Small tools are a must. Sand the outside with 180 - 400 grits, then use micromesh to ~5000. Cut off with a sharpen butter knife or other thin parting tool. No finish is needed. Clean out the jam chuck and do another.

Make a Morse taper jam chuck to clean up the bottom of your nut. Use masking tape to secure it to the chuck, turn the bottom.

Want to make a bowl? Mount the nut sideways.

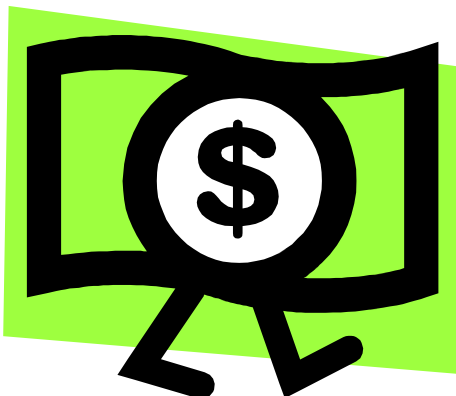

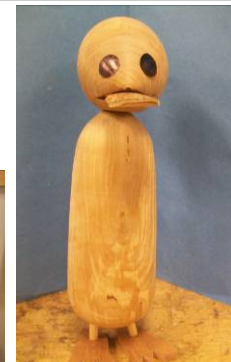
