## Turning Challenge:



## Tool Storage Idea:

If you are looking for quick access to your lathe tools see the caddy shown below. It is made on rollers from a dolly purchased at Northern and readily available at many supply houses. Of course you can make the dolly if you wish though the dolly is almost as cheap as four wheels purchased separately. Simply mount an A-frame on top of the dolly and attach home made tool holders to the plywood. Those shown are 2x4's drilled with 1 inch holes which are slotted on the band saw for easy tool drop in. The other side has an assortment of nail, screw and dowel hangers to hold just about anything. The shelves in between are great for chucks, jaws, centers, etc. The best thing is it rolls to the most convenient location around the lathe. This is especially nice for positioning if you can turn on both sides of your headstock.
