Demo: Triangle Bowl with Ray Deyo

Mounting the wood different ways on the spindle makes interesting shapes. You can mount the wood grain parallel or perpendicular to the lathe head. You can even mount the wood diagonal from corner to corner.

Important Points: Sharp tools are a must as you are turning lots of air. Keep the tail stock up & tight because there are only 2 points of contact. The wood must be a perfect cube or the corners will not match (Ray used a 5.5 inch cube). Don't move the tool rest while the lath is running as it is hard to see the moving corners.

On the turning part.

- 1. Cut the corners off on two points (more secure attachment) making an isosceles triangle (1"). Find the center of the cut offs, mount the wood. Hand spin first. Increase the speed to the shorten air time while cutting.
- 2. Watch the direction of the moving wings & cut off 3 wings not used. Taper toward the head stock, start shaping the bowl base and cut a tenon at the head stock end.
- 3. Switch to a 4-jaw chuck. Mount the wood (use the tail stock for a while) and finish shaping the base. Work up to shaping the tips. Uniform thickness is necessary as it will be very obvious if not. Fix any flats (not a perfect square). Sand the wing tips now while the bulk of the wood is still in the center. Remove the tail stock, saw off the center nub and turn out the rest of the middle. Tips will spread [Continued on page 2]

with the centrifugal force. You can a drill depth hole if needed. Sand the inside of the bowl with the lath off. Ray sands to #400 grit with the last one going with the grain.

4. Use a jam chuck with leather to clean up the tenon bottom. Cut a slight concave into the tenon while cutting it off and use a power sander to finish the bottom.
