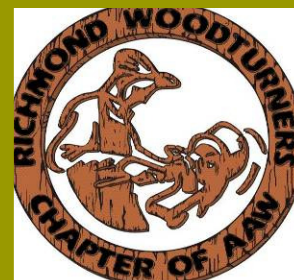

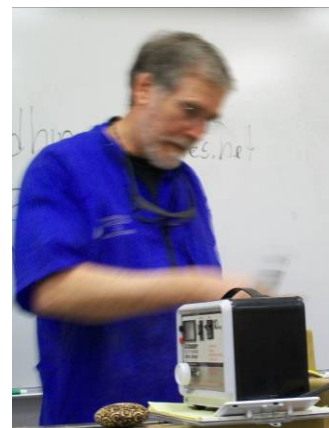
## Texturing with Jim Bumpas

Jim said texture plain wood like cedar & maple. Why pay money for pretty grain wood then cover it up? He divided up texturing into 3 parts.

1. Mechanical methods (gouges, wire brush, chatter or texturing tools). Chatter tools are for end grain only. Texturing tools are for side grain.

2. Power tools like Forham, Arbortech, and routers. Use them with the indexing abilities of your lathe. Mount the tool to a stand for stability and make sure the base is level and the cutter is at the lathe center. Make multiple passes.

3. Burning methods can use anything from a Detail burner, propane torch, soldering irons or the home-made Wood Vaporizer. In all cases leave the side walls a bit thicker for texturing after hollowing. And NO finish or sanding sealer before burning. For long pieces Jim leave a collar for the steady rest to ride on. Use Nichrome wire (20 ga) to make your own burning tips. Make your own handles too. Wood Vaporizer uses a 10 amp, 12v battery charger to BANG it up a bit. 18 ga wire for the Wood Vaporizer. Google Graeme Priddle for the wood vaporizer and Molly Winton for the small hand unit. Please clean up wood chips and update your fire and health insurance before starting the Vaporizer. Clean up after burning with a wire brush and alcohol. **[Continued on page 2]**

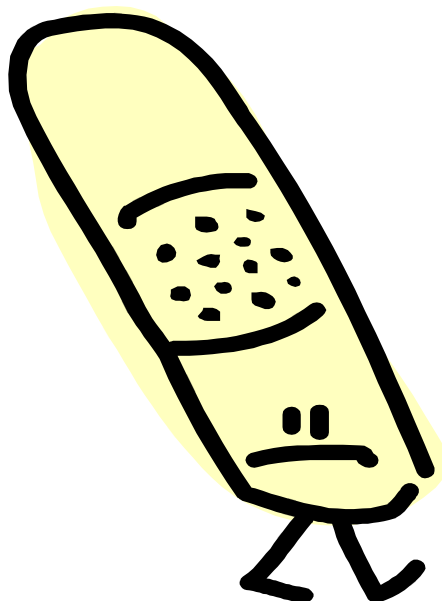

4. Sand Blasting. Need an enclosed unit that recycles the grit. #20 is fine. Removes the soft part of the tree rings.

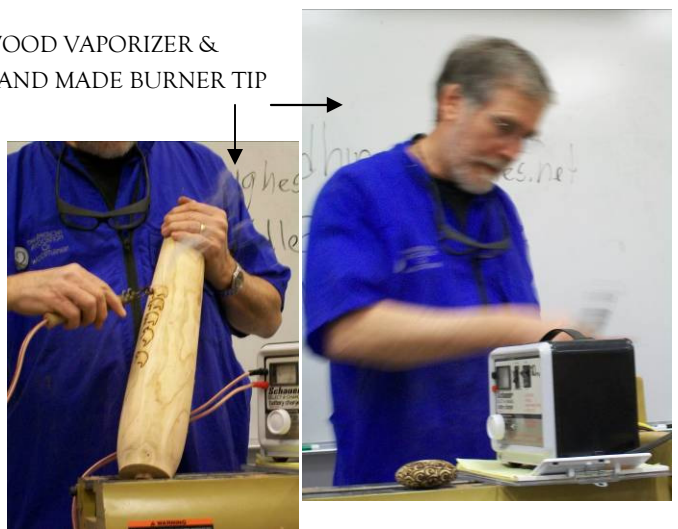

Nominations for President: Dick Hines; Resource Manager – Agree R

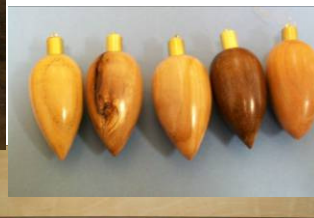
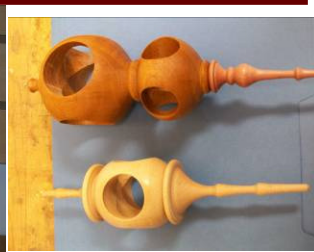
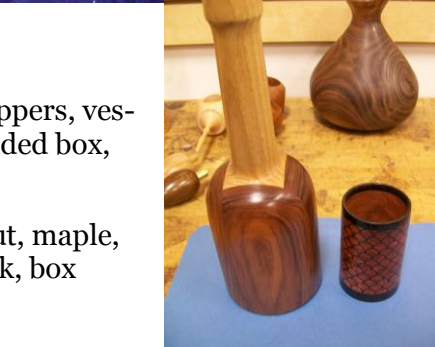
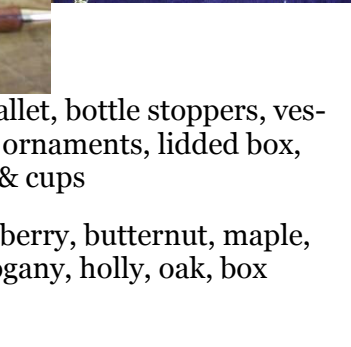
