EGGS Made by a Few Good Eggs

Deane Cox, Danny Luttrell and David Sterling turned eggs while all watched. Eggs are considered the most difficult turning because everyone knows what an egg looks like and the diameter of the egg keeps changing. They are turned between centers than placed into a PVC spring chuck for turning off the ends.



A template of a real egg will help you get started. A 2 X 2 X 3" block makes a nice Grade A egg. Round up the block, mark the center & ends. Remove the excess on both ends and with a parting tool cut down to the diameter of the center of your egg (must be a close fit to your chuck). Shape & sand the egg as much as possible on the lathe. Mount the egg into the egg chuck and turn & sand the ends. Dick Sing has a good book on ornaments & eggs.




Meeting Vibrations
