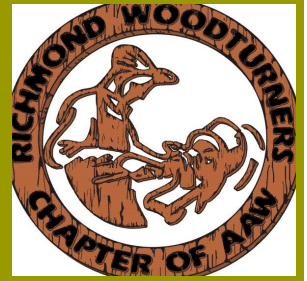

Vases or Canteen on 2-Axis

Aage gave a demo on canteen/2-axis vases.

He drilled the center out and used the 4-jaw chuck in expansion mode for 1 axis and a tenon for the other. Be sure to hollow around the handle tabs. Tenons were cut for drilling the neck or cut it in half to hollow out the insides, then glue it back together (lots of clamps). Hide the seams with burnings or inlays.

OR for another way that Aage tried: Drill out the top with a Morse taper drill bit. Grain runs the length of the blank. Drill out the center with a big Forester bit (big enough for the chuck). Drill from both sides. Turn the top, turn the base. Taper the body. Rechuck & open the hole on the front. Clean up the front. Leave some heft on the foot to keep cats from dumping it over. Hollow the inside until the neck hole shows in middle of piece. Reverse chuck, flatten the end, hollow out the other side. Taper the surface concave or convex. Cut a recess 1/8" in the outside hole for a plug on both sides (helps the canteen hold water). Shape plugs so it blends into the body.

Pen Turners Sept 2013: Shawna gave a demo of pen tube painting. She uses acrylic Liquitex from AC Moore. White tubes not good for molding acrylic. Mix let sit for the bubbles to reach the top. Pour slowly, no need for vacuum or pressure. Buying resin for Wood Whysism. Color brass tubes with base color first, let dry. No sanding of tubes. Dilute paint so it flows, brush on at angle. Mix in a little white -sticks better. Sky first, grass, let dry. Then birds, trees, foreground things. We all got a tube to paint & painting stations were set-up for us. Mine has fingerprints all over it- think I will try again. Next meeting October Baseball bat pens .

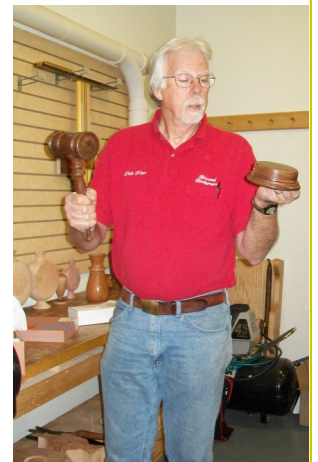
Dr Sara Robinson, Oregon State U, lecturing on spalting wood. We might get the DVD
