

## Production Turning with Mike Lane

Mike gave a interesting demo on Production Turning. He has a contact that sends him work from the historical district of Church Hill. Mike uses a Oneway lathe with enough extensions to be able to turn something 9 feet 6 inches. He does have a day job, but need extra money for he is a tool junkie. Mike charges ~\$25 / hour just to turn. Most of the prep work is done by his contact.

Lots of finials are produced. The closer together they are, the more alike they should be. Mike uses a

story stick for multiple pieces. Three diameters are measured & marked out. The rest are by eye. Wear a face shield as most of the big columns are glued up and come apart.





When sizing grooves set & stay with the same set. Mike showed that calipers can differ enough between them to be visually obvious. He likes the Galbert caliper. Woodcraft use to sell them. Before finishing cuts, hone your tool and use the heel of the skew to peel off wood. If you get vibration, change tools. All wood is different and needs its own tool selection. 
