

Neal Bland's demonstration was contagious. Working to perfect the tippe top to work proved to be a challenge and then after doing the first one, it was difficult to stop making them.




The last of a series. Jacaranda base and lid, koa finial, padauk accent ring. About 8" high by 3 1/2" wide. Finished with wipe on poly.

Sycamore 7" diameter lacquer finish

Round bottom bowl: 9" x 1.25", Sycamore finished with water-based alkyd varnish. Turned from what was left after preparing some blanks for the Tops turning marathon. Since it was thin, I turned the bottom spherical, sanded, filled a few cracks with CA and applied a poor coat of CA to the bottom before mounting with a 5" diameter vacuum chuck to hollow. Got lucky with pretty uniform 1/8" wall thickness!

This cherry bowl is 11-3/4" in diameter and 3-3/4" tall. It is finished with Tried and True Danish oil and buffed with Beall buffing system.

Segmented wig stand. The woods are Primavera and Walnut with a plywood inset.

This hollow form is an example of a way of including a live edge that is not the rim of the opening. The way it is turned actually results in two live edges. The wood is chestnut oak and the finish is Danish oil.

Powermatic 3520a. It's been a great lathe for me and still has plenty of life left in it. I've had it for about twelve years and have been very pleased with it. In the spring of 2020 I put in a new VFD, as the original one failed. Also in February of this year, I replaced both the spindle bearings and the motor bearings.....it runs much quieter now. It sits on a mobile base and can be moved around the shop fairly easily.

The motor is strong and quiet. Banjo and tailstock lock down tightly. Headstock and tailstock centers align perfectly. It's not as pretty as it once was, but you can definitely still make a lot of beautiful things with it. It runs on 220 v power. It comes with spur center, live center, 14" tool rest.

Tip

From Dan Luttrell

Are you aware that there is a pilot on the 1-1/4 x 8 lathe head shaft? This is designed to center your chucks and faceplates, repeatedly, on the head shaft. This also applies to the 1"x 8, and the 3/4" x 16 head shafts, and probably others as well. The threads are only there to hold them tight.



If you have a faceplate made with a "standard" 1-1/4" x 8 nut, do not let it engage with the pilot as shown in this photo.



Always ensure the nut is short enough, or there is a spacer installed to prevent contact as shown in this photo.



Installing anything without the necessary counterbore to fit the pilot can damage it and prevent your chucks from being installed properly.
